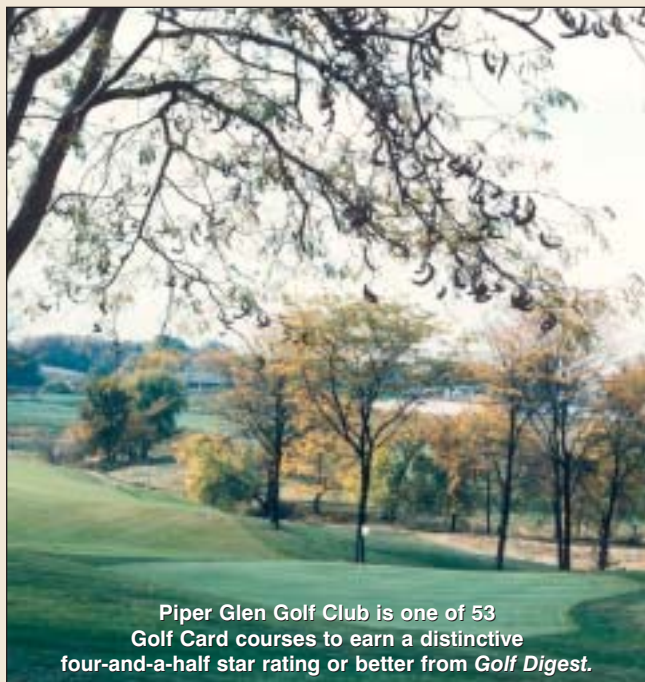

The Best of Golf Card



Piper Glen Golf Club is one of 53 Golf Card courses to earn a distinctive four-and-a-half star rating or better from *Golf Digest*.

In the annual directory issue, we designated more than 160 Golf Card courses that rated four stars or better in *Golf Digest's* Places to Play 2002 edition. Since then, the 2004 edition was released, and several more Golf Card courses — including some that became affiliates in the past two years — achieved four-star status.

But which courses are the best of the best — the better-than-outstanding courses that received four and a half or even five stars? Impressively, there were 52 Golf Card courses that earned four and a half stars. And Golf Card affiliate Big Creek Golf and Country Club in Big Creek, Arkansas was one of only 16 courses to rate five stars — one of the highest recommendations a golf course can receive.

While the 2004 edition is the most recent publishing of Places to Play and won't be updated again until 2006, there were still many courses — including

Golf Card courses — that were too new to be rated. So if you don't see a course in the following list that you insist is a four-star course, we didn't miss it. It probably wasn't rated yet.

Illinois man wins car in Golf Card sweepstakes

Golfers love to tell stories. The career shot, the hole-in-one, hitting a par five in two. Well, Roger Metzger of Decatur, Illinois has an incredible golf story that didn't even happen at the course.

This spring Metzger received a call from Golf Card headquarters notifying him he won the Member Sweepstakes contest he entered. At first, Metzger thought it was a mistake – he never filled out any cards or forms for a sweepstakes. But what he forgot about was the friend he referred to join the Golf Card last year – which automatically qualified him to for the sweepstakes drawing.

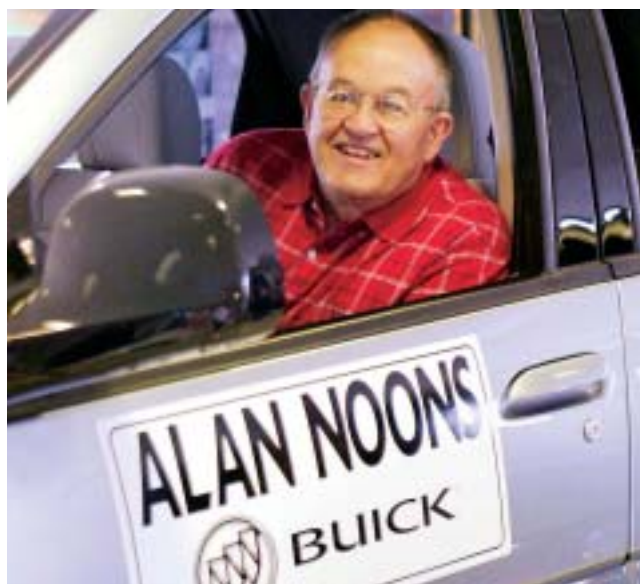
When he asked what he won for this contest (that he didn't know he entered), he was expecting something like a set of clubs or a supply of balls. When told he would be getting the keys to a \$27,000 Buick Rendezvous, Metzger didn't believe it – literally. It took several minutes to convince him this was no hoax or prank call and that he really did win a new car.

"I'd never won anything before and didn't ever expect to," said Metzger, 65, a retired management services worker.

Actually Metzger had the choice to take the car or \$20,000 in cash. He said he and his wife had been about talking about getting a new car (to replace his 5-year-old Buick) so the choice was easy.

Golf Card International President Bruce Hoster flew to Illinois from Colorado headquarters to present Metzger the keys to his car. The ceremony took place at Alan Noon's Decatur Buick-GMC dealership in Forsyth, where Metzger picked up the car (and picked out the color). His wife Claudia accompanied him and was looking forward to test-driving the new "family" vehicle. Also on hand was reporter Tony Reid of the local newspaper who wrote a full-page article on Metzger's good fortune.

Round Tip: A Turn for the Better

Making a good shoulder turn on the backswing is essential to creating power and consistency. Many golfers struggle to make a complete, 90-degree shoulder turn. I see golfers stretching, twisting and straining to turn back with little success. Many times a senior golfer will come to my lesson tee complaining of shorter back swings because of lost flexibility.

The problem is usually not the lack of flexibility. The problem is the golfer is not making a complete hip turn which will stop the shoulders short of a full turn. To show you what I mean, sit on the edge of a chair and try to turn your shoulders as you would in a backswing. You will find that your shoulders only turn a few degrees because your hips can not move.

So to make a complete shoulder turn you will need to turn your hips. You will find that a hip turn of around 45 degrees will be about right. Notice in the picture that I have made a complete shoulder turn. Notice also how much my hips have turned from their address position. That is why I always say one good turn will make another.

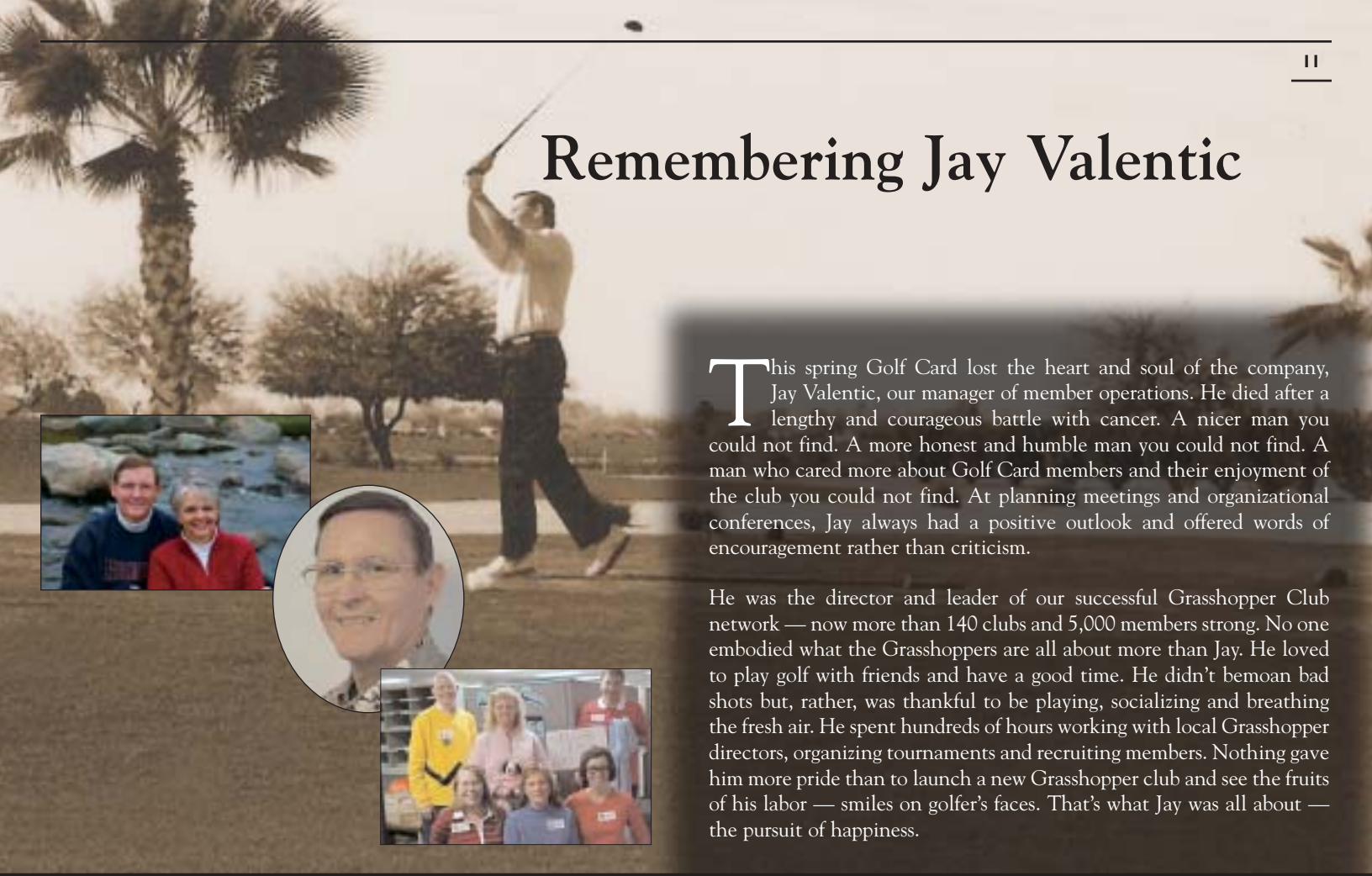

This spring Golf Card lost the heart and soul of the company, Jay Valentic, our manager of member operations. He died after a lengthy and courageous battle with cancer. A nicer man you could not find. A more honest and humble man you could not find. A man who cared more about Golf Card members and their enjoyment of the club you could not find. At planning meetings and organizational conferences, Jay always had a positive outlook and offered words of encouragement rather than criticism.

He was the director and leader of our successful Grasshopper Club network — now more than 140 clubs and 5,000 members strong. No one embodied what the Grasshoppers are all about more than Jay. He loved to play golf with friends and have a good time. He didn't bemoan bad shots but, rather, was thankful to be playing, socializing and breathing the fresh air. He spent hundreds of hours working with local Grasshopper directors, organizing tournaments and recruiting members. Nothing gave him more pride than to launch a new Grasshopper club and see the fruits of his labor — smiles on golfer's faces. That's what Jay was all about — the pursuit of happiness.

One of my last memories of Jay is him coming to our hotel in Colorado last year. We were passing through and wanted to see him. Even though he was sick, he came to see us. He said, ‘This is what it's all about.’ He felt good being with us.

He was the finest gentleman I ever met.”
